Throughout my career, I have traveled to more than 50 countries and have made some embarrassing cultural blunders along the way, so I applaud your efforts to seek out cross-cultural training resources.

It is important that you begin the process with the right mindset so here are a few tips to get you started on your cultural journey:

Keep an open mind, be respectful, and approach differences in a non-judgmental way.

Find a trusted colleague who can serve as a "cultural advisor" and ask them for feedback on how to behave in their country.

When in doubt, listen and observe the locals intently. This will help you learn about cultural nuances and help you avoid embarrassing faux pas.
